We offer our students a diverse range of activities which include Table Tennis, Spikeball,

Tennis and most anticipated by all—Surfing. Being in such close proximity to a beach

gives us lots of advantages and the school really emerges from its chrysalis in summer months. Howe strand brings a certain magical element or 'draíocht to Gurraneasig NS.'

Responsible citizenship is cultivated from an early age through school participation in the Green School Programme, Beach Clean-up, National Spring Clean and the Amber Flag

programmes.
Parents are regarded as partners in their children's education: an ethos which underpins all school activities. Parents are invited to share their expertise and special interests with the student body through biannual workshops which included horse grooming, a day in RTE studios, beach yoga, engine mechanics, woodworking, and herbal medicines to name but a few.
